In the course of the event a number of trade presentations were made by Italian and Indian speakers including:

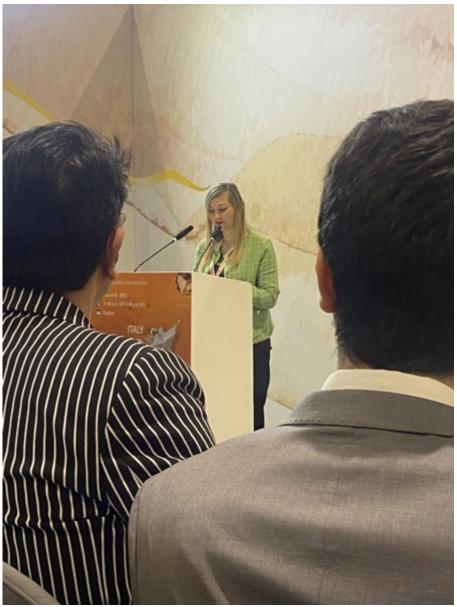

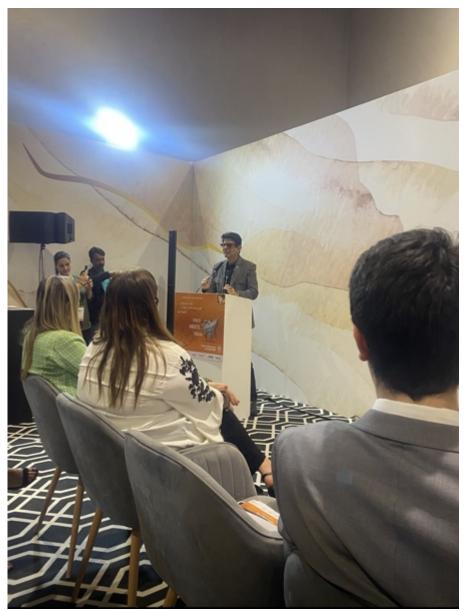

She also brought out as to how the name **Fishing Cat** signifies a good omen and how it is also finding a good favour and liking with pet lovers in India.

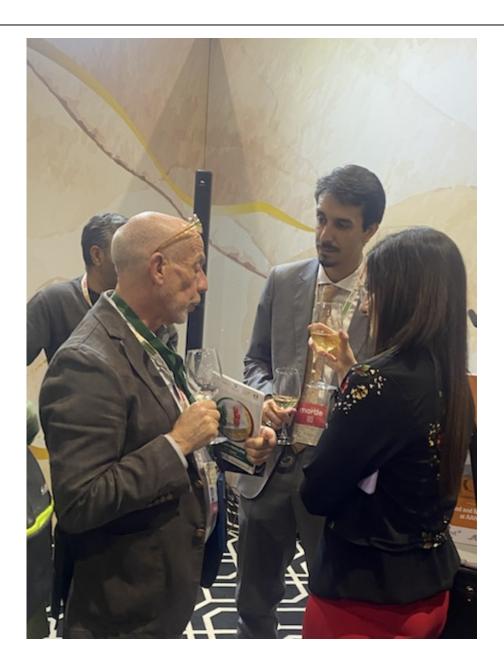
